**TEMA:** Past Continuous - Review

**Referencia Gramatical:** 

En esta oportunidad, realizaremos una nueva lectura de la explicación gramatical del tiempo "Pasado Continuo". En ella, podremos observar ejemplos de cómo se estructuran los distintos tipos de oraciones (Afirmativa, Negativa, Preguntas con WH-Words y Preguntas y Respuestas Cortas). Además nos explicará la función de este tiempo en particular y determinados TIPS a tener en cuenta al momento de usarlos. ## 1. PAST CONTINUOUS

#### Form

You form the past continuous with was / were + -ing. You use the contracted form in spoken and informal written English.

Affirmative	Negative

he was waiting	he wasn't (was not) waiting
she	she
it	it
you	you
we were waiting	you weren't (were not) waiting
they	they

Questions		Short answers
Was	I he waiting? she it	Yes, I/he/she/it was. No, I/he/she/it wasn't.
Were	you we waiting? they	Yes, you/we/they were. No, you/we/they weren't.

#### Question words

How long was she waiting? What were you doing?

#### **Function**

You use the past continuous:

- to talk about actions in progress in the past.
   I was talking to your sister.
   People were waiting outside the palace.
- to ask about actions in progress in the past.
   Were you looking for me?
   What were you doing when I phoned?

 to contrast actions in progress in the past and actions happening at a point in past time.
 While I was shopping downtown, I met my friend Sara.
 I fell and hurt my hand as I was running for the bus.

#### Remember!

You use when to ask about actions happening at a point in past time:

What were you doing when you met Dad?

You use while and as to talk about actions in progress in the past:

Carlos broke his leg while / as he was playing football.

#### Remember!

You don't usually use these verbs in the continuous form:

believe hate hear know like love need smell sound taste understand want
